

ROMANIZATION OF MALDIVIAN (DHIVEHI)

BGN/PCGN 1988 Agreement, with modifications 2009

An official romanization system was submitted to PCGN by the Maldivian government in 1987 and approved by BGN and PCGN in 1988¹. The system presented here reflects the 1988 Agreement with minor modifications introduced by the government of the Maldives in 2009².

⁴ These letters are used in Arabic loanwords, and are unlikely to be found much in place names. Dhivehi Raajje is 'country of the Maldives'; the state title also contains a further /j/: ދިވެހިރާއްޖޭގެ ޖުމްހޫރިއްޔާ (Dhivehi Raajjeyge Jumhooriyyaa – Republic of Maldives, where Jumhooriyyaa is an Arabic loanword).

NOTES

1. Maldivian is read from right to left.
2. The symbol ◌̣ appearing in the Vowel Characters table represents any Maldivian consonant character.
3. The character ހ is not romanized. If it bears a vowel character, that vowel character alone is romanized (e.g. ޞަލާމް ޞަލާމް *En'boodhoo*).
4. When characters ސ and ހ appear in combination with a supercircle (the 'sukun', which usually marks the absence of a vowel, see the Diacritical Mark table above): ސ̣ ; ހ̣, these characters are not romanized but the following consonant is doubled (e.g. ޯޯޯޯ ޯޯޯޯ *Kalhehuttaa*), unless the following consonant is a digraph in the romanized form, in which case they are romanized **h** (e.g. ޯޯޯޯ ޯޯޯޯ *Kerehdhoo*). ސ̣ and ހ̣ appearing at the end of a word are romanized **h** (e.g. ވަވަވަވ *Veyvah*).
5. ސ is romanized **n'** when appearing without any vowel or auxiliary sign (e.g. ޯޯޯޯ ޯޯޯޯ *Kan'dufushi*).
6. ސ̣ is romanized **iy** when appearing in combination with a supercircle (ސ̣̣), (e.g. ޯޯޯޯ ޯޯޯޯ *Ziyaarayfushi*).
7. The 'Romanization' columns in the tables show only lowercase forms but, when applying the table, uppercase and lowercase Roman letters as appropriate should be used, as in the Romanized examples in the final columns.
